

# Frequently Asked Questions About Beyarmudu Home Composting Pilot Program



## What if I need help with my composter?

SAVE staff will visit each volunteer family at least once a month to provide help and support. If you need additional information or help, just call 228 1925



## How much will it cost me to participate in the pilot?

Participation is free. In fact, SAVE will provide you with free training on how to compost as well as a composter and waste bin to get you started. You will also save money by producing your own compost rather than buying it at the store.



## Is it possible to buy 100% organic compost from stores?

Finding 100% organic compost, can be difficult. However, you can easily find non organic compost in major supermarkets, local garden centers, nurseries and flourists.



## How long will it take to produce compost?

It generally takes four to six months to produce usable compost.



## What if the compost smells?

You will receive information on how to care for your compost pile and how to deal with any problems that arise during the training session scheduled in December 2007.



## Where can I purchase a home composting unit?

The composters used for SAVE Home Composting Pilot Program have been produced by local capenters and blacksmiths using recycled polyethylene barrels or wooden power cable cylinders. You can either ask your local carpenter or blacksmith to produce one for you or use a standard waste bin instead.



## Can I start home composting without being in SAVE's Pilot Program?

Yes! It's very simple. SAVE can provide you with the Home Composting Guide, then all you need is to get a composting unit and to follow the steps outlined in the guide.
